George's awards include the **Gold Tripod** for Best Nature and Wildlife Film, 1998 (Australian Cinematographers Society) and the **Palme D'Argent**, France 1999 (World Festival of Underwater Films). In 2003 he won **Best Film** at the Australian Oceans Film Festival and in 2004 George received the prestigious **Whitley Medal** (Royal Zoological Society of NSW) for best publication on the natural history of Australian animals.
